PSSA GIRLS SOCCER 2023

Dear Parents/Carers,

Your child has been chosen to represent the school in the Girls **PSSA Soccer Competition** to be held every Friday beginning on the **28th of April** (T2-W1) and will include 10 rounds of competition, concluding on Friday the **20th of June** (T2-W10).

Your child has been selected in the **Grays Point Junior/Senior GIRLS Team**. All matches for both the Junior and Senior teams will be played at Box Road fields each week.

The current season's draw is attached. This year, **Kick-Off is at 1pm for Juniors**, with **Seniors** beginning roughly 35 minutes later (**1:35pm**). Juniors play 15 minute halves and Seniors play 20 minute halves. Parents and carers are always invited to support our teams' matches. Please ensure your child wears **full school sports uniform** each week as well as bringing **soccer boots** (plastic studs only: no metal studs allowed) and **shin pads** (note: socks must entirely cover shin pads). We will provide players with a jersey that will need to be returned at the end of the season. We would ask all players to also provide a pair of football socks – we use white socks with red stripes. Plain white or red socks are also fine.

Training for Juniors and Seniors will be on **THURSDAYS at LUNCH TIME**. Students should be dressed in their normal school uniform and joggers – they do not need to wear boots to training, but will need to have them each week to play their game. Please meet Miss Wymer at the bottom gate after eating time. **Training will commence when the oval reopens (estimated to be around Week 2/3)**. Miss Wymer will notify students when this is.

Code of Conduct sheets for parents (spectators) and children will also need to be returned and signed by both students and parents before the commencement of the season. **The Code of Conduct will be fully implemented. Students not upholding the expectations will not be able to represent the school.**

The total cost for PSSA this term will be \$90. This will be invoiced with term costs. Students will be given a jersey for the season. Failure to return shirts will result in an additional replacement fee. Please note that there will be no refunds for wet weather due to bus cancellation charges.

Your commitment to this payment is essential if you wish your child to play PSSA Soccer this year. A school sports program is offered at school to those students who have not been selected into PSSA teams.

Please return the permission slip below and the code of conduct sheets **before Thursday 27th April** (T2-Wk1). **Your child will be unable to participate in PSSA Soccer until this documentation has been received.** We look forward to another successful year of soccer!

Players' Code

Rationale:

Representing the school in PSSA Competitions provides an opportunity for talented athletes to extend their skills and compete against similarly skilled students from other schools. Representing the school is an honour and students have a responsibility to compete at all times in a manner that brings credit to themselves and their school. The following Code of Conduct has been devised to guide the achievement of this outcome.

- Control your temper and behaviour whilst on and off the playing field and make no criticism either by word or gesture.
- Whilst on the sidelines do not touch any sporting equipment. Sit and support your participating school mates.
- Be modest in success and generous in defeat (i.e. don't show off when successful or be a bad sport when defeated).

Parents'/Spectators' Code

- Remember that children play sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children to always participate according to the rules and the officials' decisions.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game. Positive comments are motivational.
- Applaud good performance and efforts from each team and congratulate all participants upon their performance regardless of the game's outcome.
- Show respect for your child's opponents for without them there would be no game.
- Show appreciation of volunteer coaches, officials and administrators for without them, your child could not participate.
- Do not publicly question the officials' judgement and never their honesty.
- If you disagree with an official raise the issue through the appropriate channels in writing rather than questioning the official's judgement and honesty in public.

CONSEQUENCES RE BREAKING : CODES OF CONDUCT

Students:

Should a student break the code of conduct that they have signed they must be prepared to accept both the responsibility for and the consequences resulting from their actions at sport. These include:

- Missing future events;
- Being sent off and replaced for the remainder of a game
- Possible suspension from future Zone sporting events;
- Not eligible to represent the school at Zone PSSA
- Accepting consequences in line with the Cronulla Zone PSSA code of conduct and the Department of Education's code of conduct.

Parents/Spectators:

Should parents/spectators break the signed code of conduct they need to be prepared to accept both the responsibility for and the consequences resulting from their actions at a Cronulla Zone PSSA sporting event. These include:

- Being asked to leave the premises or ground/park by a Zone teacher/Convener;
- Meeting with their school principal to discuss future attendance at Cronulla Zone PSSA sporting events;
- Police being called and parents/spectators being charged with section 60E where Zone teachers feel that student or teacher safety is threatened or intimidated by either verbal or physical abuse.
